THE RESULTS

Council's 12 months monitoring report data:



Air quality **worsened** on our boundary roads, **worse than borough wide-trends** (p76) **FAIL**



Cycling on internal roads only increased by **1%** (p70) **MARGINAL**



NO data collected for walking **FAIL**



Speeds on our internal roads **decreased** on average by **only 0.4mph** (p37) **MARGINAL**



NO data collected for road safety **FAIL**

THE RESULTS

Council's Consultation Online Survey feedback, since the trial started:

SAFETY

70% feel less safe using the streets at night, or experience no change (p15 & 16)

62% feel less safe using the streets during the day, or experience no change (p15 & 16)

ENVIRONMENT

59% experience no change or find the air dirtier (p15 & 16)

55% experience no change or find the streets look worse (p15 & 16)

55% experience no change or find traffic noisier (p30 & 31)

52% experience no change or find there is more traffic on their streets (p30 & 31)

WALKING/CYCLING

63% experience no change or find it harder to get to local shops and services by walking and cycling (p25 & 26)

61% experience no change or are walking/cycling less to local shops and businesses (p20 & 21)

61% experience no change or find it harder to make trips that they need to make by walking and cycling (p25 & 26)

58% experience no change or are walking/cycling less for shorter journeys (p20 & 21)

Very limited camera fine exemption has been granted for our disabled Highbury residents, and none for other Highbury residents and our businesses.

THE REVENUE

Whilst the data and survey results show the Highbury community is not reaping much LTN benefit, it's much better news for Islington Council:

Highbury's top 3 LTN camera fines (to 2022):

Highbury Place (2 cameras) - **£1.14m**

Highbury Hill - **£1m**

Aubert Park - **£.987m**

Total Council revenue from
Highbury LTN camera fines:

£4.961m



This is 46% of the £10.8m
LTN camera fine revenue
that Islington Council has so
far collected in across the
borough!
